Mentors are paired up with an at-risk per teen for the whole year, and spend time at Big Day Out day-trips participating in fun and developmental activities. There is also a 2-day camp coming up in March which kicks the year off.

If your application is successful, a compulsory training session will be held on Sunday 15th of February OR Tuesday 24th February (you must attend one) so please keep one of those dates free.

Mentors must be aged 24 - 40 (with some small exceptions made for slightly younger mentors) and LYF are really on the hunt with some urgency to locate more mentors, so please feel free to also reach out to your networks.

LYF also ask that all mentors commit to the weekend camp and at least 3 of the four full-day Big Day Outs. The key dates for 2015 are as follows:

- \* Pre Camp training - Sunday 15th of Feb (afternoon) OR Tuesday 24th of Feb (evening)
- \* Camp - Friday 6th of March to Sunday 8th of March

- \* BDO#1 - Saturday 9th of May
- \* BDO#2 - Sunday 28th of June
- \* BDO#3 - Saturday 5th of September
- \* BDO#4 - Saturday 31st of October

#### **Bright Blue Mongolia Interplast Project**

Rotary District 9455 in conjunction with Bright Blue is organising a Luncheon function with the WA Police Commissioner, Karl O'Callaghan in support of Bright Blues Mongolia Interplast Project.
